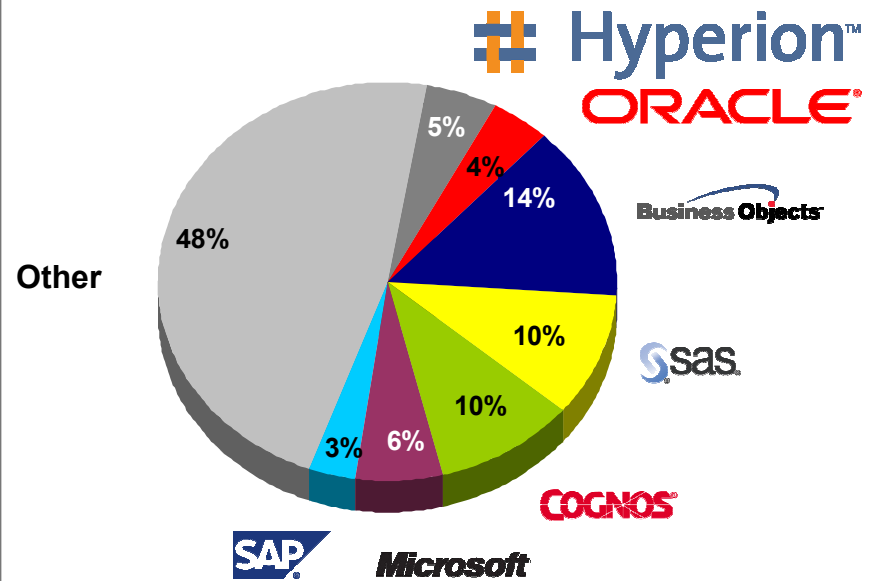

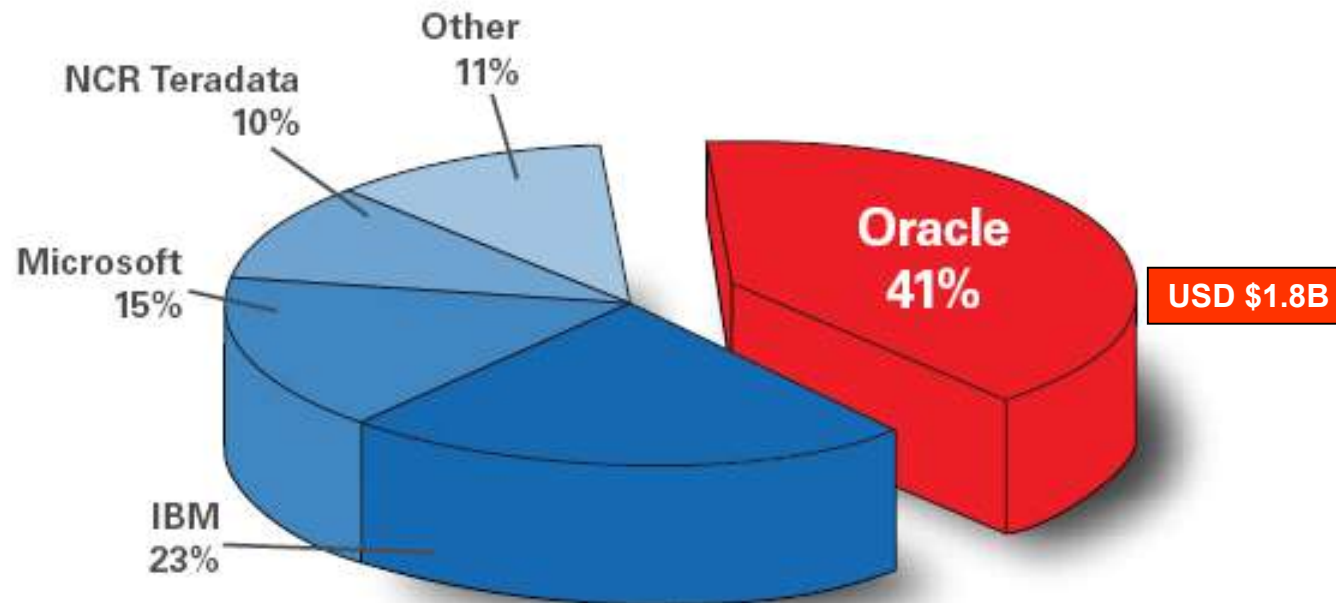

Oracle #1 for Data Warehousing



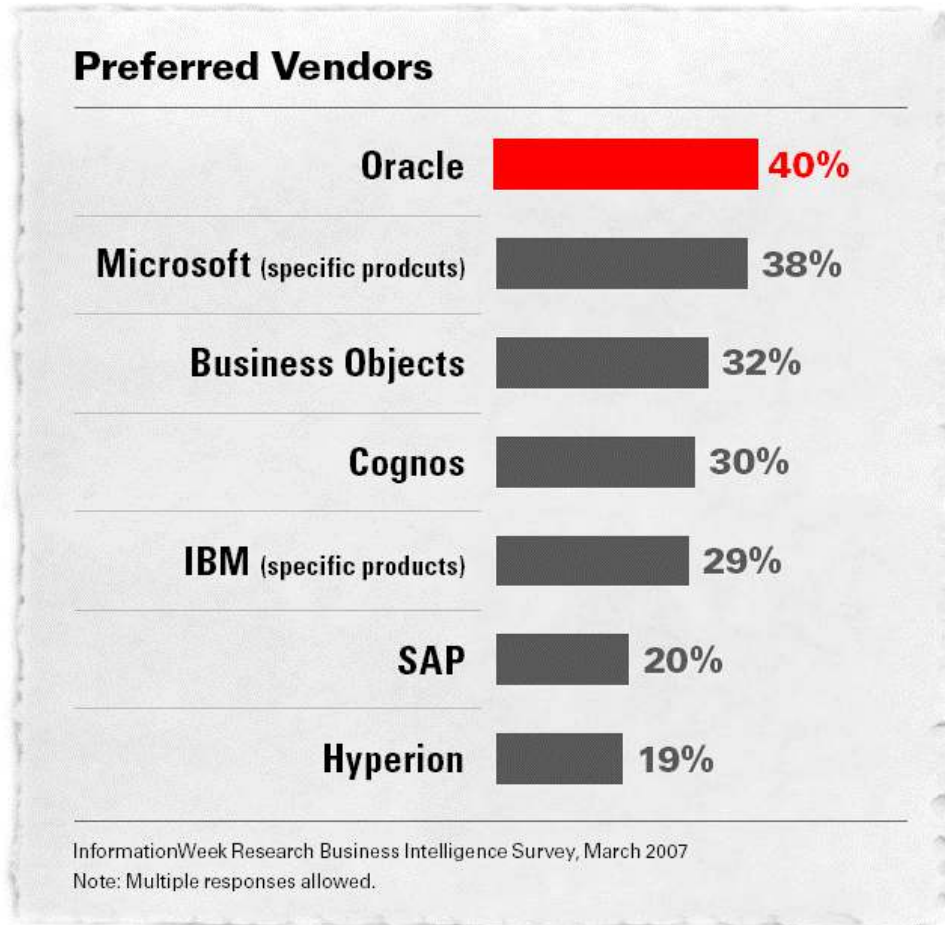
Worldwide Data Warehouse Management

Oracle Philosophy Changes

- 2003: Charles Phillips joins Oracle
 - Software Industry Analyst
 - Growth Through Acquisition
 - Growth Through Interoperability
- 2005 - present: Strategic Acquisitions
 - ERP (PeopleSoft, Siebel, Retek, etc.)
 - BI/EPM (PeopleSoft, Siebel, Hyperion, etc.)
 - Integration/Middle Tier (Sunopsis, Oblix, etc.)
 - Technology (TimesTen, Innobase, SleepyCat, etc.)
- Our stable: representative of most IT organizations
- Consequence: Fusion/Hot Pluggable
